

On behalf of the University of Cincinnati and UC Health, we are pleased to support the city's 2023 Green Cincinnati Plan. The goals advanced in this year's GCP are laudable and will continue to advance key priorities of carbon reduction and urban sustainability that have made Cincinnati a national leader in these initiatives.

Both of our organizations have seen the impact climate change has had on our community. University researchers have been key partners in developing components around the plan, including documentation of the impact of heat islands. Decreases in the urban tree canopy and the prevalence of concrete, asphalt and other building materials have made some neighborhoods in the city up to ten degrees hotter in the summer months.
