

Population Demographics (FAQ)


The population of the community broken down by age group. The numbers at the top of each bar indicate the number of people in the age bracket below.





NOFA Homes

- Phase I homes completed in 2018
- Phase II homes completed in 2019
- Phase III, is being developed by the Madisonville CURC for homeowners earning 120% AMI. Four (4) infill, single-family homes will be built.







Our Recent Development - Apartments



The Jameson (PLK Communities)

- First residents welcomed in April 2021
- Scheduled completion December 2022
- 152 market rate and workforce units
- Landmark application currently pending on the Historic Stewart Home

The Red (Circle Development)

- Phase I welcomed first residents in May 2018
- Final building opened to a wait list September of 2020
- 298 market rate units





Our Recent Development - Mixed Use



The Madamore (Ackermann Group)

- Phase I includes 104 market rate units & 10K sq ft. commercial
- Phase II to include 116 market rate units & 7K sq ft. commercial
- Phase III to include 94 market rate units, 30-foot public plaza, public art, and the new home of our Madisonville Library Branch, and 10K sq ft of comemrcial
- Phase I completed April 2020
- Phase II scheduled completion December 2021
- Phase III scheduled completion TBD


Medpace Campus

<u>Our Mixed Use Development – Food</u>

Access

Our Goal:

To provide healthy food options within our neighborhood footprint that compliments Plan Cincinnati and Madisonville's Quality of Life Plan to maintain walkability in out neighborhood for basic needs.

Recommendation:

Provide reasonable accommodation and DCED support to interested grocers that want to create community in Madisonville.





Our Affordable Housing Struggle

Dilemma

- Lack of affordable housing based on current AMI
- Lack of funding available for housing repair programs
- Increased property taxes resulting in financial difficulty



Recommendation


- Leverage City dollars (TIF, AHT) to strategically work with a developer willing to build income-based housing
- Leverage volunteer base to tackle small repairs
- Continue to cultivate Housing Forum topics that are impactful residents.

Transportation and Safety - Walkability

Our Goal:

To make access to our 3 neighborhood business districts safer and more efficient, especially for seniors and students.





"Create a walkable, pedestrian-friendly, mixed-use neighborhood business district at Madison and Whetsel" - Madisonville Quality of Life Plan (2012)

Recommendation:

- Better crosswalk visibility
- Target Safe routes to schools
- In partnership with DOTE, we will install new signs, paddles and beacons at new and existing pedestrian crossings.
- And of course, a "Flat Frank"!





Transportation and Safety – Our Bridge





<u>Transportation and Safety – Our Bridge</u>

Our Goal:

- Prevent repeated damage to the train bridge at Madison and Kenwood.
- Reduce number of first responder calls to this location to free up resources in other areas of District 2.

Recommendation:

- Creative signage for over height vehicles
- Work with DTE to find solution that works best in the long term for Madison Road traffic as well as pedestrian safety.
- Earmark budget dollars to provide a solution to save resources and lives.
