

Criterion 1: Historic Significance

- Example of the outward spread of German Catholics in Cincinnati in the late 1800's-early 1900's.
- St. Leo The Great parish was one of the first German Catholic schools in North Fairmount in 1886.
- Represents history of social and education activities of the expanding German Catholic Population

St. Leo The Great School Building

Criterion 3: Italian Renaissance Revival

- Designed by John Clifford Grunkemeyer
- Symmetrical façade
- Prominent projecting entryway with Doric columns and stone entablature
- · Arched entry door
- Stone belt courses above 2nd and 3rd stories
