RESOLUTION NO. 29 - 2021

RECOGNIZING and honoring Virginia Scott, Director of Nursing Services for the City of Cincinnati, for her work during the COVID-19 pandemic and as a representative of all the nurses who have served on the frontline providing medical care to patients suffering from Covid-19

WHEREAS, Virginia Scott is the Director of Nursing Services for the City of Cincinnati and has been a leader in the City's response to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is an illness caused by a virus that can transmit from person to person and has spread across the world, creating a global pandemic that is having catastrophic effects on human life, our community, and our economy; and

WHEREAS, in response to rapid spread of COVID-19, nurses have been on the frontlines of the pandemic, directly responsible for taking care of COVID patients and their families, amidst danger to themselves, and limited resources; and

WHEREAS, Virginia Scott, in her role as a public servant and public health leader, has successfully managed this response on behalf of all our City's heroic nurses; and

WHEREAS, nurses have the highest rate of infection among all healthcare workers; and

WHEREAS, each nurse we lost to COVID-19 was a valued member of our community, and contributed to our communities' safety during a devastating time; now, therefore,


BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Cincinnati, State of Ohio:
