

Illegal Dumping Program

Illegal Dumping Abatement

- Providing resources to remove litter and debris
- Bridging communication between communities and government agencies to address dumping hot spots
- Monitoring chronic dumping locations to aide law enforcement + City officials



Illegal Dumping

- Some neighborhoods are plagued by chronic illegal dumping
- Many communities hard hit with acts of environmental crimes are also those with the highest economic despair, leaving the residents with little to few resources to tackle the problem
- Illegal dumping has a detrimental impact on Cincinnati's environmental, economic and social health
- A reduced quality of life

Illegal Dumping Public Health

- Mosquito or disease carrying pests
- Air, soil, and water contamination
- Exposure to harmful or hazardous materials
- Can leach into local waterways, which ultimately contributes to oceanic pollution
- Attracts other crimes
- Social-well being and overall community moral





Illegal Dumping

Monitor on average 30
 dumpsites each month

 We captured 278 illegal dumping incidents on camera this year (January 2023 to September 2023)






Number of Dumping Incidents by Neighborhood

Don't Dump the 'Nati

Illegal Dumping Pilot Program Results

- Program ran for 11 weeks (April 2023 to June 2023)
- Every Friday from 8am to 12pm
- 554 vehicle loads during the 11 week period
- Over 50 Tons of diverted waste
- 46 zip codes represented
- 658 Rumpke landfill vouchers handed out to participants
- 350 resource guides Distributed
- Top items disposed were building materials, furniture trash
 bags and landscape debris
- 20% Reduction in CSR complaints during the pilot program
- We asked participants if having a place in the City to dispose
 of waste is helpful and 100% of them answered YES!






Illegal Dumping Items Dumped
