Statement

The City Manager's recommended FY26 budget showed a balance of fiscal responsibility with increased investment in the largest priority areas of this Council and the community. This included investments in quality-of-life enforcement through the Law Department and Buildings and Inspections. We continued Access to Counsel, meaning representation and rental assistance for those who need it most. We bolstered our Public Service employees with the technology and resources they need to better handle weather events and respond to constituent needs alongside record investments in facility and infrastructure improvements via the Cincy on Track plan. And finally, we continued our commitment to funding housing and economic development with investments in critical programs such as Quick Strike, NCCIP, and the Affordable Housing Leveraged Fund.

The adjustments shown above represent further commitment to investment in growth, neighborhood support and government efficiency and sustainability. These modest investments yield an incredible return and show our commitment to the sustainable growth of the city.
