



History

- 1863: H. & S. Pogue Department Store founded
- 1878: Moved to larger store at 4th & Race St. (demo. in 1988)
- 1926: First satellite building (demo. 1996)
- 1949: Service Building (310 Race St.) opens
 - Designed by noted local architecture firm, Hake and Hake.
 - Could hold 20,0000 garments in a climate-controlled area.
- 1966: H. & S. Pogue Service Building is sold
- 2024: Seeking Historic Tax Credits to convert into residential



Recommendation

The City Planning Commission recommends that City Council take the following actions:

- 1. APPROVE the proposed designation of the H. & S. Pogue Service Building as a Local Historic Landmark at 310 Race Street in the Central Business District under Criterions 1 and 3 of the Cincinnati Zoning Code (§1435-07-1a); and
- 2. ADOPT the conservation guidelines.
