MEMORANDUM Budget Policy Direction to City Administration for Recommended FY2025 Budget

1. Public Safety

- a. Support recruit classes for both the <u>Police and Fire</u> departments and the <u>Alternative</u> <u>Response to Crisis.</u>
- Maintain funding for the <u>Pedestrian Safety Program</u> to implement traffic calming measures and prioritize the most vulnerable road users.
- c. Continued funding for the <u>Street Rehabilitation Program</u> to maintain our public roadways and advance the objectives of <u>Complete Streets</u>

2. Thriving Neighborhoods

- a. Stormwater Management Utility Funding green stormwater infrastructure such as "bioswales" and "rain gardens" to alleviate storm sewer capacity and overland flooding in strategic locations.
- b. Continued contribution to the <u>Human Services Fund</u> at 1.5%
- c. Support for the construction of "launch ramps" and <u>recreational access along the Mill</u>

 <u>Creek</u>
- d. Continued support for home repair programs such as <u>WarmUp Cincy</u> and <u>HARBOR</u> to repair, retrofit, and weatherize aging housing stock for the purpose of reducing energy burden and code violations.
- e. Funding for <u>Neighborhood Support Program and Neighborhood Business District</u>

3. Growing Economic Opportunity

- a. Invest in <u>workforce development</u>, particularly the Urban Leagues' Building Futures program.
- b. Provide relief for those struggling most with increased property taxes.

- c. Investment in <u>multi-modal transportation planning</u> such as bus, bike, and potential streetcar expansion infrastructure.
- d. Fund <u>economic development organizations and anchor events</u> such as African American Chamber, Cintrifuse, CincyTech, Black Tech Week, etc.
- e. Invest in efficiency improvements for economic development processes.

4. Fiscal Sustainability

- a. Implement measures to ensure a <u>structurally balanced budget</u> in FY 2026 after ARP funds run out.
- b. Increased Pension contribution on current glidepath.
- c. Continued identification and application of <u>State and Federal grant opportunities</u> to provide public services, maintain and improve public infrastructure, and reduce overall costs to the City.
- d. Increased funding to the <u>Revolving Energy Loan Fund</u> to further leverage the Inflation Reduction Act and advance the goals of the Green Cincinnati Plan.

5. Excellent and Equitable Service Delivery

- a. <u>Abatement of litter and blight</u> through continued support of the Department of Public Services and Buildings & Inspections.
- b. Invest in efficiency improvements for Constituent Service Request system.
- c. Additional FTEs in the Department of City Planning to support <u>proactive zoning</u> updates and historic preservation.
- d. Increase the capacity and scope of <u>parking enforcement</u> through additional FTEs in the Department of Community & Economic Development
- e. Funding <u>deferred maintenance</u> on the schedule outlined in the proposed "Cincy on Track."
