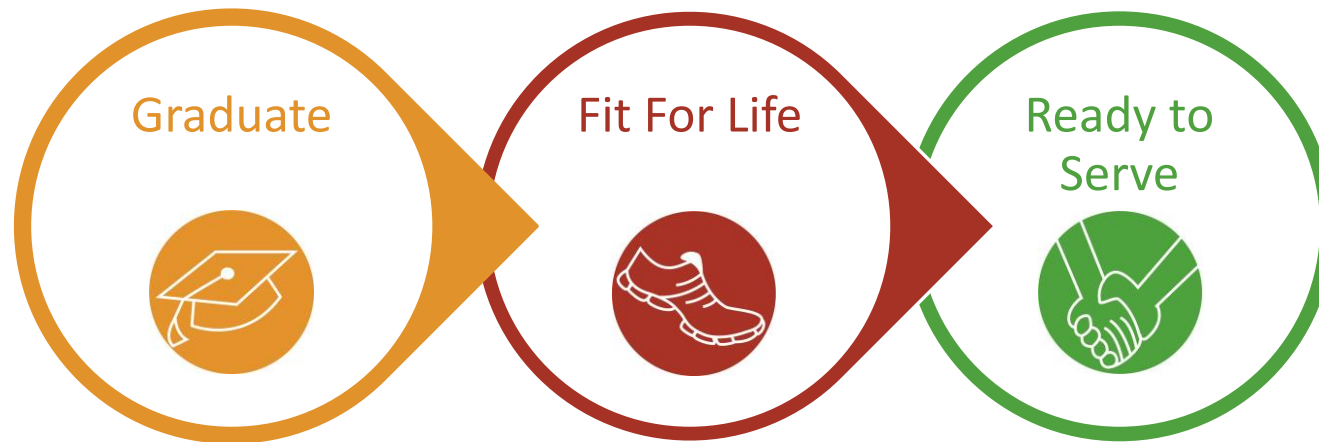

# Why We Serve Roll Hill

---

- 286 Units at the Villages at Roll Hill
- 480 residents between the ages of 5-18
- 97% of those children are in households making 0-\$25,000 per year
- There are no resources for youth within walking distance

# Boys & Girls Clubs at Roll Hill

---

## ROLL HILL TODAY

- Boys & Girls Club @ Roll Hill Elementary **since 2009**
- The Roll Hill Elementary program **serves about 60 kids per night/about 100 kids per year**
- Current program serves **grades K-8, no high school students**

## ROLL HILL FUTURE VISION

- **\$750,000 allocated** by the City of Cincinnati to build a Boys & Girls Club at Roll Hill
- **Property for construction has been identified** by the owners
- A Boys & Girls Club **will cost approximately \$3 million to build** and **\$400,000 to operate** to serve annually

# Partnership with City of Cincinnati

---

Boys & Girls Club requests an **additional \$2.25 million** (\$3 million total) from the City of Cincinnati to construct a Club at Roll Hill

- Boys & Girls Clubs is **committed to operating a full-scale program** costing approximately \$400,000 per year
- Program would **serve 130 kids per day/300 kids per year ages 5-18**, M-F after school & during summer
