2020 Homicide Investigation Overview

In 2020, the City of Cincinnati experienced a total of 94 homicides. This was 21 offenses higher than last year's total of 73 offenses, representing a 28.7% increase. Currently, the Homicide Unit's 2020 closure rate is hovering around 67%, with 63 of this year's 94 cases either being closed by arrest, death of offender, prosecution declined, or awaiting grand jury presentation. The following classifications provide the method of homicide, victim's age, gender, location by District and neighborhood:

Summary;

In 2020, the greatest number of homicides occurred in District Four with 26 offenses, accounting for 28% of the total. This was followed by District Three with 25 homicides or 27% of the total. District Five's 20 homicides accounted for 21%, District One's 14 at 15%, District Two with 7 at 7%, and CBS with 2 at 2%.




Homicide Victims across Cincinnati: 01/01/2020 - 12/31/2020



Homicide Victims across Cincinnati: 01/01/2020 - 12/31/2020






Homicide Victims across Cincinnati: 01/01/2016 - 12/31/2020





Victim Witness Advocacy CCROW



- 61 witnesses received assistance in 2020 (every witness received crisis intervention services and case management ongoing contact)
- 5 cases with witnesses were resolved through pleas trials were halted due to COVID-19
- 21 individuals in the EPH-PIVOT to provide victim/witness services
- 22 victims of crime from districts 1,2,3,4, and 5 were assisted in 2020 which is a 10% increase from previous years.
- New partnerships:
- HCJFS to assist witness in overcoming employments related benefits and to help families achieve and maintain self sufficiency.
- Free Store Social Services Department; St. Vincent DePaul for assistance with immediate resource needs



Victim Assistance Liaison Unit
