



We are requesting \$2.5 million in capital dollar support from the American Rescue Plan Act for MORTAR to lead the development of this plan.







By developing these learning tools, MORTAR will exponentially deepen our impact in Cincinnati by drastically increasing our capacity to reach entrepreneurs who are unable to attend our in-person program.

Our plan is to release the technology in three different tiers. Tier One will be an estimated seven modules - and available at no charge for the end user. Tier Two, will be the digital version of our extensive 15-week, culturally competent curriculum. Finally, Tier Three will take the learnings from our existing program to the next level; introducing additional growth strategies, learning more about the benefits of certifications, processes of expanding or selling a business & more.
