STATEMENT, (DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY) submitted by Mayor 1. John Cranley, City Manager Paula Boggs Muething, and Commissioner Melba Moore, In response to the public danger arising from verified cases of contagion of SARS-CoV-2 and the COVID-19 pandemic, and based in part upon the declaration of a statewide emergency in Ohio by Governor DeWine, I declared a public emergency pursuant to Article III of the Cincinnati Charter and Article XVIII of the Administrative Code of the City of Cincinnati in March 2020. The March 2020 Declaration of Emergency was followed by emergency orders addressing public health concerns and related City operational needs that have arisen during the COVID-19 pandemic. After declaring a state of emergency and instituting severe measures to "flatten the curve" - including a broad stay-at-home order rates of infection dropped. The State of Ohio began to reopen Ohio's economy, sector by sector, in accordance with good hygiene and social distancing measures. In consultation with the City Manager and the Health Commissioner, I replaced the March 2020 declaration with a new

Emergency Declaration that was consistent with the State's reopening efforts. The June 2020 order was tailored to the State's reopening phase of the pandemic response. Rates remained steady for much of the summer due to the diligence of our citizens and business in wearing masks and engaging in social distancing; we were optimistic that as a City we might have turned the corner on the pandemic. With the advent of cooler weather, the City of Cincinnati, the State of Ohio, and the country are all experiencing a new, pervasive, and more dangerous wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. The State of Ohio is breaking contagion records from the spring and summer on an almost daily basis, and the resulting cases threaten to overwhelm the health care system if not abated. Multiple states have issued new lockdown orders, and Governor DeWine has warned that extreme measures will be required in Ohio if the State doesn't change its trajectory for the better. This rapidly worsening COVID-19 wave requires a new mayoral declaration of emergency to allow for a rapid response to increasing cases as the holidays and winter conditions will again test the City's economic, social, and public health systems. By this Declaration the Mayor, in consultation with the City Manager and the Health Commissioner, declares a public danger and emergency under Article III of the Cincinnati Charter and Article XVIII of the Administrative Code. In so doing, the Mayor has emergency authority to take such steps as may be necessary to help slow the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic in the City and to assist with the rapid delivery of vaccines that may become available in the coming months. This declaration is consistent with the statewide health emergency declared by Governor DeWine, the issuance of Ohio Department of Health's compulsory health orders and related guidelines, and the fundamental need to protect vulnerable populations during this pandemic. This Order supersedes the continuing June 29, 2020 emergency declaration as to any conflicts. All emergency orders issued under the June 29 declaration are hereby reissued. This declaration and related emergency orders shall continue in effect in accordance with the terms of Article XVIII of the Administrative Code. This amended and revised declaration shall be issued to the news media for the widest possible dissemination to the citizens of Cincinnati. DECLARED this 16th day of November 2020.

STATEMENT, (JOINT EMERGENCY ORDER), submitted by Mayor John 2. Cranley, City Manager Paula Boggs Muething, and Commissioner Melba Moore, Pursuant to Article III of the Cincinnati Charter, Article XVIII of the Administrative Code of the City of Cincinnati, and Ohio Department of Health Orders, I hereby order that public meetings of the City of Cincinnati shall be suspended until Monday, December 14, 2020 to prevent non-essential gatherings of the public and City employees. The region is experiencing unprecedented intensification of the COVID-19 pandemic and decisive action is needed to reverse the course and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 to the City's vulnerable populations. Under this Order, the Mayor or City Manager may grant meeting exceptions as necessary and on such conditions that the City Manager may establish to protect the general public and the health of City employees. The Administration is authorized to take all necessary and proper actions to implement this order, including by relaxing applicable codes, rules, and regulations as necessary to provide for safe alternatives

In addition, the Administration shall have authority to toll time limits imposed by rule or regulation for any matters delayed or rescheduled as a result of this Order. The Administration shall implement this Order consistently with applicable Open Meetings requirements and take steps to ensure that City business may proceed with participation by members of the public and without undue delay or interruption. This Order is based upon the existence of a condition of public danger or emergency, as established by the Mayor's November 16, 2020 Declaration of Emergency for the COVID-19 pandemic. This Order expires at 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, December 13.

STATEMENT, (AMENDED JOINT EMERGENCY ORDER), submitted by 3. Mayor John Cranley, City Manager Paula Boggs Muething, and Commissioner Melba Moore, Pursuant to Article III of the Cincinnati Charter, Article XVIII of the Administrative Code of the City of Cincinnati. and Ohio Department of Health Orders, I hereby order that in-person attendance by the public at meetings of the City of Cincinnati shall be prohibited through Sunday, February 14, 2021 to reduce the potential for large indoor gatherings of the public and City employees. The region continues to experience dangerous intensification of the COVID-19 pandemic and strong action is needed to slow the course and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 to the City's vulnerable populations and to prevent City meetings from becoming "superspreader" events that materially affect the City's ability to perform essential government functions. This Order affirms the City Manager's ongoing authority under this Order and the City Charter to limit public and employee access to City buildings and facilities due to the pandemic. The Administration is further authorized to take all necessary and proper actions to implement this Order, including by relaxing applicable codes, rules, and regulations as necessary to provide for the safe conduct of City business. The Administration shall have authority to toll time limits imposed by rule or regulation for any matters delayed or rescheduled as a result of this Order or prior orders. Nothing in this Order prevents the Administration from continuing to implement such measures as may be required to provide the public, City officials, and City staff with options for remote participation in public meetings including by phone or other remote meeting software. The Mayor or City Manager may grant limited exceptions for small, in-person public meetings as necessary and on such conditions that the City Manager may establish to protect the general public and the health of City employees. The Administration shall implement this Order consistently with applicable Open Meetings requirements and take steps to ensure that public hearings and other City business may proceed with public participation and without undue delay or interruption. This Order is based upon the existence of a condition of public danger or emergency, as established by the Mayor's November 16, 2020 Declaration of Emergency for the COVID-19 pandemic, and as separately established by adoption of this Order. This Order expires at 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, February 14, 2021.
