



What Does Restructuring Mean?



Taking a Data-Driven approach

 CPD will soon operate with 4 districts (not including Central Business Section)

Projected Timeline: End of 2023

Requirements for this to happen:

- Realignment district boundaries
- Redistribution of personnel
- Facility enhancements
- Community awareness

There will be no disruption of police services.

- Efficiency in staffing





Figure B. Example of Calls for Service Map

How Will This Affect Police Services?

Police services will not be impacted by this restructuring plan. Meaning, response times have been carefully analyzed to assure efficiency and adequate response to emergencies.

Police facilities are not hubs for officers to respond to and from calls for service. Patrol vehicles are an officer's workplace.

What occurs at district facilities:

- Roll Calls (start and secure from location)
- Station Runs (bathroom or evidence storage)
- Public appearing in-person to file police reports



How Will Current Personnel Be Redistributed?

Patrol Officers and Supervisors

- Districts will have a cap on the number officers reassigned
 - Proportionally allocated using calls for service
- Officers will rank districts in order of preference; assignments granted via seniority

Neighborhood Liaison Unit Officers

- Attempt to maintain stability by assigning NLU officers to district with reassigned community
- Introductions for communities with new NLU officer

Investigative Unit Officers

- Districts will have a cap on the number officers reassigned
 - Proportionally allocated using case loads


