**Title:** ORDINANCE (EMERGENCY), dated 7/29/2021, submitted by Councilmember Keating, from Andrew Garth, City Solicitor, TO SUBMIT to the electors of the City of Cincinnati an amendment to the Charter of the City to require council members to resign upon offering themselves for nomination or election to a salaried non-City office during their current term on council, to require the mayor to resign upon offering himself or herself for nomination or election to a salaried non-City office during his or her term in office, and that would remove obsolete language from the Charter by amending Article II, Section 4 and Article III, Section 1.
